## Tour Site Descriptions

### **Bethany Place**

Bethany Place provides comprehensive case management and programming focused on promoting wellness and serving all people living with HIV/AIDS. There is also a Transitional Housing Program for homeless HIV + men on site.

### **Call for Help Jobe Center**

Located in Edgemont this Transitional Living Program is designed to provide shelter and supportive guidance for women for up to 24 months in a homelike atmosphere.

### **Chestnut Health Systems Fairview Heights**

HUD III is a supervised living program located in apartment buildings in Fairview Heights for homeless individuals who have a mental illness. Supported Housing Program – Shelter Plus Care for persons with mental illness.

### **Chestnut Health Systems Mainstay Center**

Mainstay HUD 1 – Permanent Supportive Housing for persons with mental illness.  
Mainstay HUD 2 – Permanent Supportive Housing for persons with mental illness.

### **Family Living Center**

The Family Living Center is a Transitional Housing Program for families with an adult head of household and children age 17 or younger.

### **Good Samaritan House**

The Good Samaritan House was established in 1998 as a Christian organization whose purpose is to support and empower families to live with dignity by offering safe and temporary housing, basic human needs and access to resources.

### **Theodoro Place Apartments**

Theodore Place is a 12-unit, single room occupancy (SRO) apartment building with on-site supportive services for single adults who are homeless.
